**Women Hear Talk**  
By Noted Humanitarian

Dr. Robert A. Hingson of the Department of Anesthesia of Western Reserve University will speak at a joint meeting of the United Lutheran Church Women and their husbands on Tuesday, at 8 in the church, 1424 Hayden ave.

Dr. Hingson, noted as a tireless clinical worker, investigator, organizer and great teacher of world wide renown, has travelled one million miles during the past quarter of a century in conquest of human pain.

In June, 1958 he lead a four month tour that covered 45,000 miles of five doctors and nine technical associates. On this tour these members of Project "Brother's Keeper", travelled by airplane, donkey and camel in order to visit missions and hospitals and bring much needed help and distribute over three tons of medical supplies costing a quarter of a million dollars.

This team of medical personnel visited thirty-two countries in Asia and Africa. Dr. Hingson directed immunization of 90,000 people against cholera, typhoid and polio.

Dr. Hingson's topic will be a portion of the documentary film he made in order to preserve the visual experiences of the tour. "Medical and Educational Survey of Asia" will be shown and commentary by Dr. Hingson.

The women of St. James, through their president, Mrs. Franklin Anton, extend a most cordial welcome to all interested persons of the community to share in this interesting and informative program.
