Fort Scott's Temperance Row.

Fort Scott, one of the towns in the State that has always been wide open, is torn now with a very bitter temperance agitation. Rev. H. G. Fraser, who for several years was pastor of the Baptist church here and is well remembered, visited the town in his capacity of State temperance lecturer. As a result a Civic Purity League was organized and information being secured every saloon in town was raided, even including prominent hotel bars that had heretofore escaped.

Tuesday night a mass meet ng was held in convention hall and attended by 12,000 people, so the papers say. Speeches were made denouncing Fraser and other members of the League and the chairman of the meeting was authorized to appoint a committee of fifty to look after the enforcement of the resolutions adopted.

The resolutions blame "a lot of shrewd fanatics'! for stirring up strife and trying to run the city, whereas the council can do so far better; denounce the interference of outsiders who do not pay taxes: state that with open saloons there is less crime, less drunkenness and a better financial condition of the city's affairs; and finally pledges the meeting "to use all lawful means" to persuade the agitators to get out of town and stay out. This last is supnosed to hint at a boycott.

The speeches were bitter and harsh words were used. Many prominent business men participated and spoke. Now the temperance people have called a mass meeting, and judging from interviews with some of them they will not be butlied and will not give

The whole State will watch the contest with deep interest, for on a small scale it foretells what may come to the whole State some day, if the resub-2 mission plank ever gets into a State 2 plutform. If the saloon men win, the day of the resubmission plank was hastened; if the temperance people win, the cause of temperance will be strengthened. Rev. Fraser's expected to return to the battlefield, despite the hinted threats, and the battle will be to a finish.
