MARY'S BEAU HAS FLED. CAN YOU SEE HIM?

MINNESOTA

KASSON—James Lake killed a mad dog while it was attacking a cow.

FARIBAUT—Louis A. Roberts, a well-known resident of this city, died at the Rice county poorhouse.

EXCELSIOR—James A. Murray, aged 52 and one of the early settlers in this vicinity, died at his home south of town.

CROOKSTON—John Hoffman attempted to drive home his cattle, which had strayed on the land of his neighbor, when the latter and his hired man set upon him and maulled him unmercifully.

DULUTH—Pat Rivers and Thomas Kagan, longshoremen, quarreled and the latter received stab wounds which caused his death. Herbert W. Craig, aged 22 years, was arrested on the charge of forging a postoffice order. He confessed.

WISCONSIN

CUMBERLAND—Fire totally destroyed the farm residence of G. Deangelo, two miles south.

LA CROSSE—Henry Hudson and John Benson, old soldiers, aged 61 and 60 years, respectively, were nearly burned to death while camping near Cape Bluff.

MILWAUKEE—Karl Lanning Warren, editor and publisher of the Sentinel, died yesterday. He had been actively engaged in newspaper work for more than twenty years.

FOND DU LAC—Christ Geiger, a prominent farmer and stone and time dealer residing at Marquette, dropped dead—Byron Fairbanks, county surveyor of Fond du Lac county, died suddenly.

ARCADIA—Wesley Lowe, aged 90 years, has regained his sight after being totally blind for ten years. Notwithstanding his advanced age, he talks intelligently and enjoys good health.

MERRILLAN—The Merrillan flour mill, owned by Nick Andrews & Co., burned with nearly all its contents. The mill was full of grain and the loss is \$10,000 to \$20,000, with \$5,000 insurance.

IOWA

DELEWAN—John Volker, an old resident, was killed by a horse.

DUBUQUE—Clarence Rawlings, 15 years old, accidentally shot and killed himself while hunting rabbits.

COON RAPIDS—Mrs. Charles Hoffinger and a child of J. H. Marritt were severely bitten by a mad dog.

CEDAR FALLS—Mrs. Buean, mother of Mrs. James Hoy, fell down a stairway and sustained a broken hip. It is feared she cannot live.

ELDON—Patrick Connelly, while switching in the yards of the Rock Island railroad, was instantly killed, his head being severed from his body.

MARSHALLTOWN—Thirty-one years an occupant of a machine is the record made by Chester Bruce, who died at the county insane asylum, aged 65.

RUTHVEN—C. J. Mueller was burned to death. He was smoking a pipe when he was taken sick and set down by the side of the road to rest. A spark ignited his clothing.

MONTEUR—Dan McCoy, the 12-year-old son of John McCoy, was fatally injured while operating a capstan. His skull was fractured in two places and his face literally caved in.

CEDAR FALLS—The case of John Benesh, of Vinton, has come to an end by the prisoner pleading guilty to the attempt to murder Miss Anna Jirsa because she would not promise to marry him. Miss Jirsa pleaded for clemency for her lover, saying she would marry him.

BLOOMFIELD—Maddened with pain and liquor, Lewis McVay, a wealthy stockman residing near here, upon being thrown from his wagon in a runaway, seized a shotgun and discharged at his wife and daughter. James and Frank McVay, James was wounded in the chest and arm and his brother's wounds are not expected to result fatally.
