Washington June 2 -The secretary of war has transmitted to the senate committee of the Philippines a copy of a report made by J. G. The next day the presidente and Gami were taken out into the woods and hung until their feet were nearly ond the ground and were asked of they would, naturally. They were returned to Matnog, where the secretary was again questioned by Lieutenant harker as to the conduct of the presidente, giving according to his (the secretary's) statement satisfactory answer. He was later, with the presidente and Characos Fuenos, a policeman of Magdalena, again taken to the hills, being compelled to carry a rope, a pick and a spade, and on reaching a certain spot the presidente was put to work digging what would appear to be a grave. Then the presidente was bound and shot in the back. The secretary says that he saw all of this himself, and also saw the policeman bound in the same way and a little later heard shots which he presumed were fired at the policeman, as he was also killed.
