## Small Grain Moves Up Two Cents

Inability to Secure Wheat for Grinding Main Cause for an Advance in Grain Market.

CHICAGO, Oct. 14.-Inability of donestic flour mills to secure wheat suitable for grinding was the main cause of an advance of over two cents a bushel in the price of wheat options here today. A big shortage in the French crop added to the feeling of buoyancy. At the close December wheat was up 2%c. May closed with a gain of 214c. Corn is up Mc. Oats show a net gain of Mc. Pro-

Throughout the latter part of the session wheat shorts were argent buyers, the December option being in the greatest favor. Prices advanced rapidly until December sold at \$1.15. May rallied to \$1.12½. The strength was well maintained, December closing at \$1.12½, while final quotations on May were at \$1.12½.

Early in the session the corn market Early in the session the corn market was inclined to weakness, mainly in sympathy with the easier tone of wheat. NEW YORK, Oct. 14—The activity of the stock market reached the boiling point today and trading took on the appearance of the great bull markets of a few years ago. It is probable that the sources of the buying have widened with the recent violent advances in the market, and some outside participation may be thus represented. Commission houses, through which this kind of business is usually transacted, report however, that the railroad business is restricted. It is certain that very large transactions in today's market were executed by single houses, buying orders for single firms running as high as 50,000 shares of various stocks. This points unmistakably to the centralized direction and control of operations under combined resources.

Such dealings were especially noticeable today in a few of the stocks in which centered the greatest activity and in which the widest advances occurred, but the movement became so general and so embracing as to carry general conviction of a wide participation in the market from many separate and independent sources. The conviction was very general, also, that a veteran operator and turfman, who has long refrained from leading operations in the market, was again conducting transactions on a large scale by very characteristic methods. The movement carried all before it, from whatever mources it came or for whatever methods. The list of separate issues dealt in was longer than at any time this year. Yesterday and today the number of long-dormant issues which moved required constant industry to trace the former transactions in order to make price comparisons. The uneasiness which was caused yesterday by the comparative negliated abouted all speculative attention, was relieved today by the revived animation of the standard railroad stocks. These were not all shares in the outset in the market's strength, but before the day was over practically all important stocks had moved forward a point or more. 


