Returns from the districts in Salt Lake county outside of Salt Lake came in slowly, and in the majority of cases were only partial.

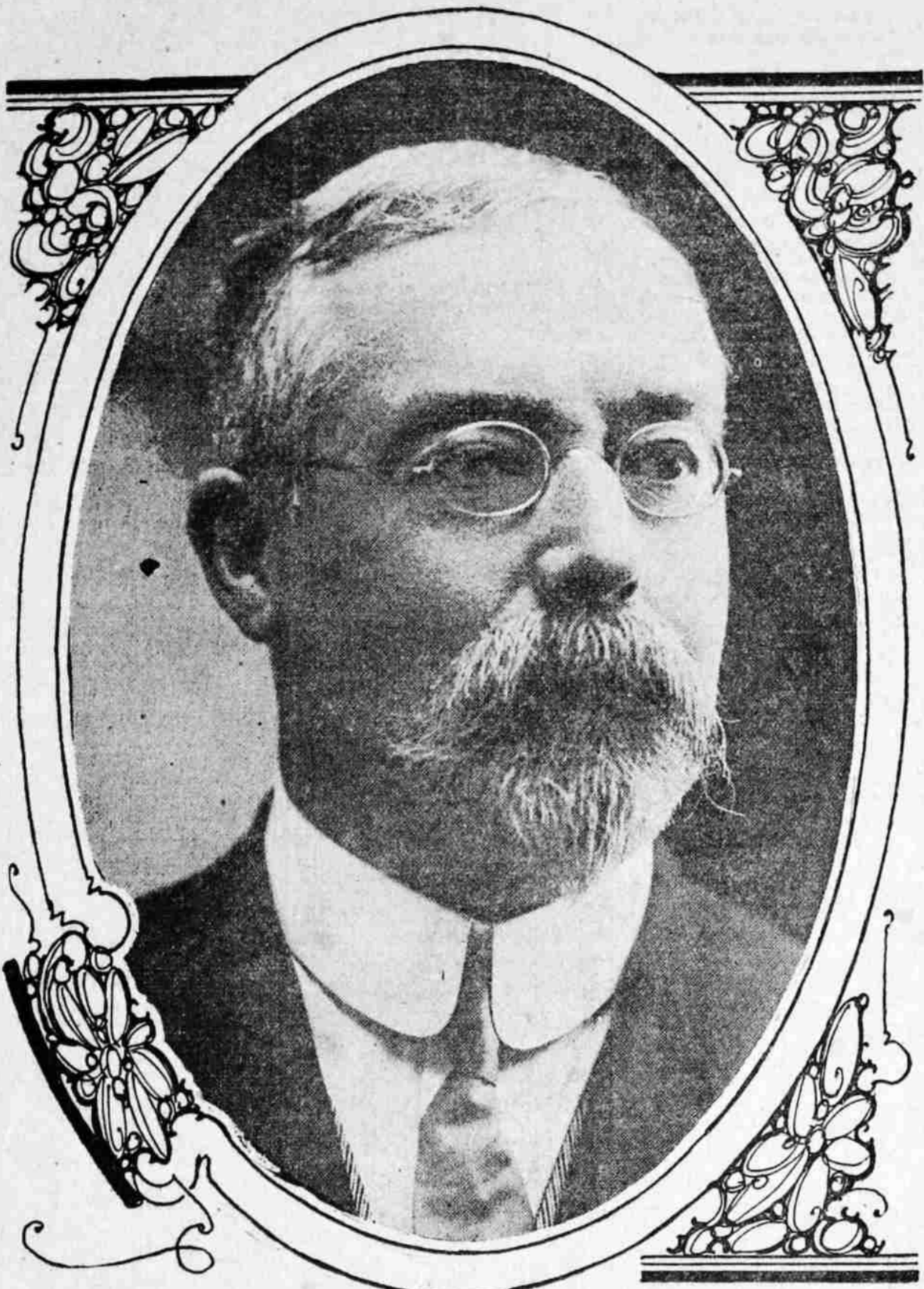
Taft gained a slight lead over Wilson early in the day, and increased the margin steadily until the polls were closed.
