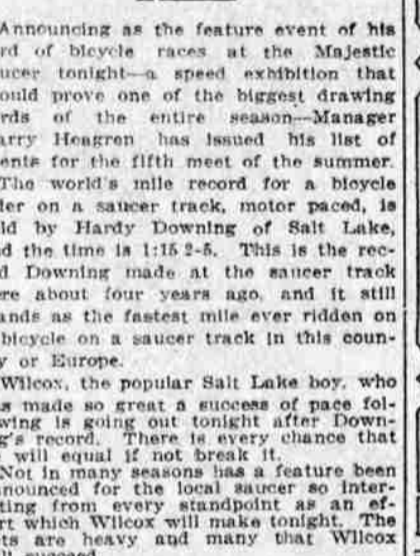

HIGH CLASS HORSES FOR LATONIA DERBY

Big Event Will Be Run Saturday, With Field of Notables.

Tomorrow the inaugural race will be run at Latonia, and this will be followed by the Derby on Saturday, June 14. The general manager of the track has received requests for box reservations from many cities, and judging by the number of reservations, the Kentucky Derby at Louisville will have nothing on the Latonia Derby as an attraction which draws.

The Latonia Derby is the culminating event in the spring for three-year-olds. A three-year-old that wins the Latonia Derby is looked upon as a champion. The English, who raced horses hundreds of years before Latonia or Churchill Downs was ever thought of, have by long experience learned that the proper test for a three-year-old is a mile and a half route. This is the route the horses will be asked to go at Latonia, and any horse which carries 122 pounds or 127 and wins over the mile and a half journey is considered a thoroughbred worthy of the name.

At present it looks very much as though a field of nine will go to the post in this big race at Ton Point, according to his owner, is a sure starter despite his defeat in the Kentucky Handicap. Nothing has been heard lately from Hawthorn, and it is quite doubtful if he will be able to go. Helios worked three-quarters very handily in 1:18 the other day, and it might be just possible that Jack Keene has the grand little gelding in better shape than most persons believe, and will make a try for the prize at the last minute. Donerail is a sure starter, and the prediction is made that the horse which beats Donerail will get the wreath around his neck.

Great Britain had some workouts, and will get a race or two under his belt within the next week. Prince Hermit will probably try the mile and a half route.

McCorkie ran one good race two weeks ago and the same said about Helios might apply to the big horse in the Kentucky Derby. The Blue Grass crowd still stick to it that Foundation is a good race horse and he will surely go to the post during all of this spring.

Gowell is a sure starter. She received a hard campaign as a two-year-old and is now being run to death as a three-year-old. Her poor race in the Kentucky Oaks plainly showed that she should have a little rest. The filly is run one day in a long race and then in a day or so she is running again. This is very trying and will throw the best of them off edge, especially as the weather is changing like it has been during all of this spring.
