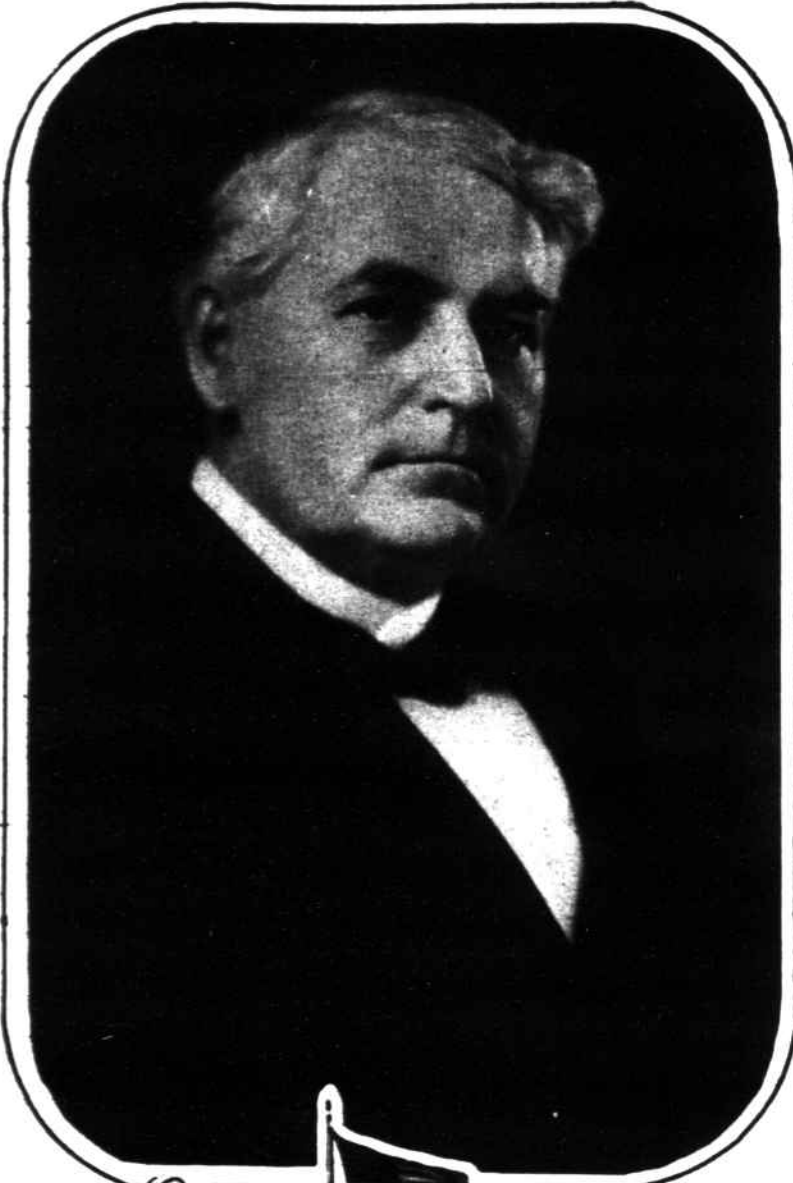
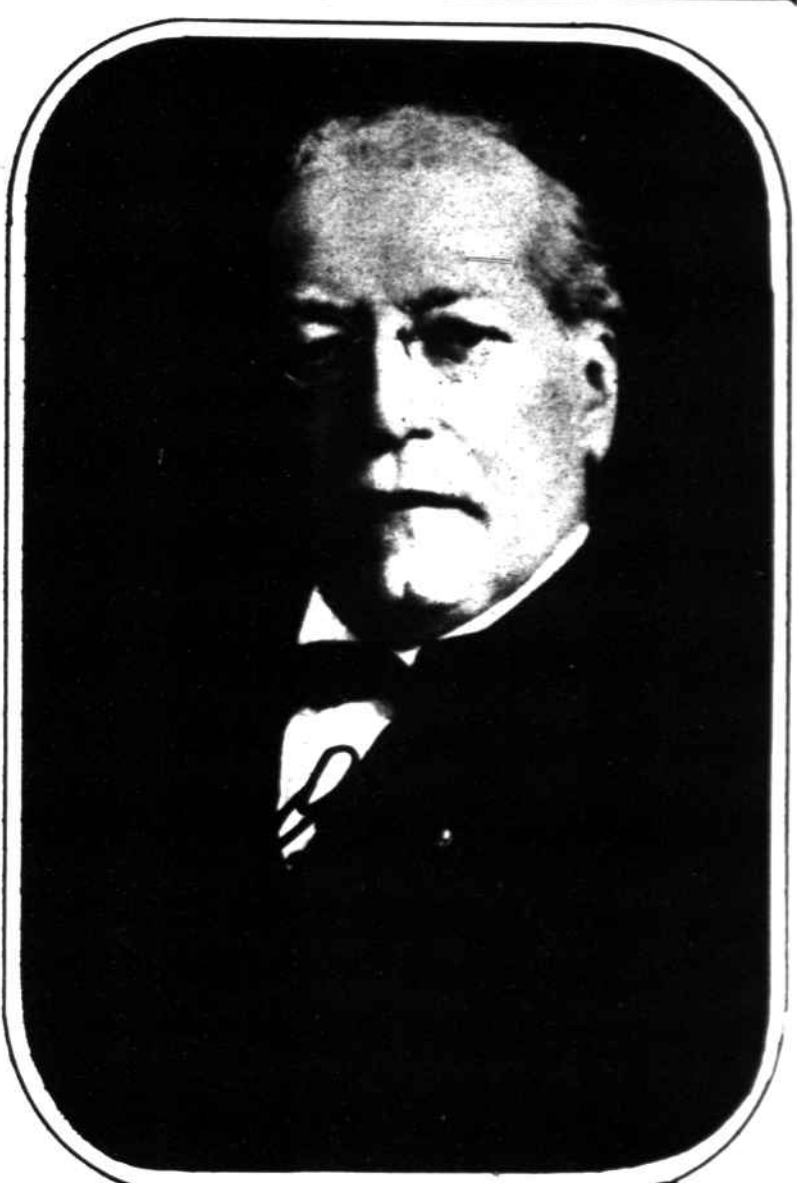

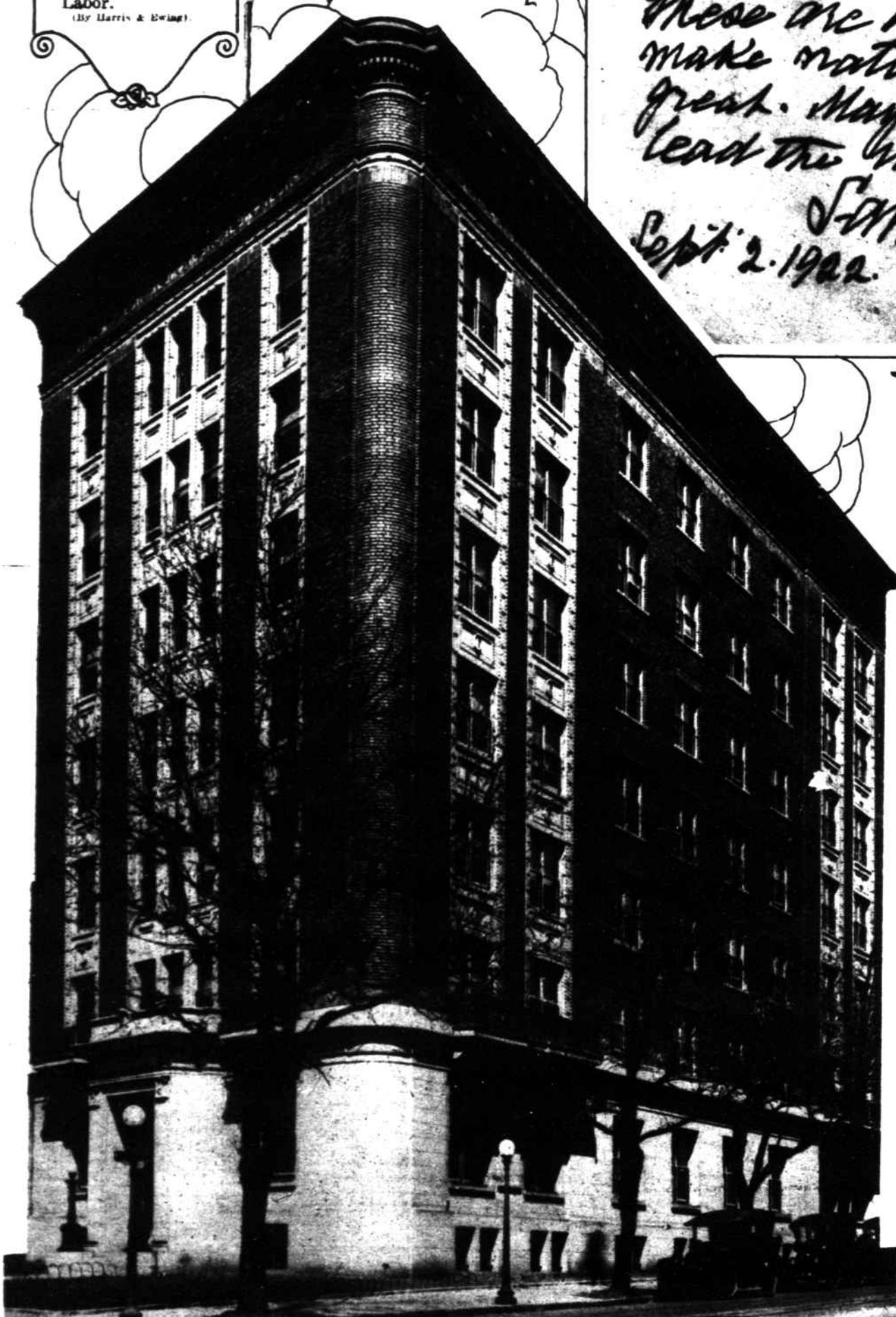
GREETING:
