The favorable report of the Senate committee on education on the resolution submitting a prohibition constitutional amendment to the legislatures of the several states for ratification indicates that the republicans feel the necessity of further action on the liquor question. The prohibition movement is drawing its energy chiefly from the republican party, which, having broken with the saloon interest, now sees the cold-water men abandoning it. The republican expectation is that the liquor question will be largely removed as a disturbing element in politics by the submission of a prohibition constitutional amendment, no matter what the result of the vote of the states may be. Even though the amendment is rejected, the prohibition movement being checked, will, it is anticipated, lose its force in politics for a number of years.

Some persons, whose sense of the dignity of office is keen, may be shocked at the rude designation of the President in the legal papers filed in a partition suit in Omaha as "one Grover Cleveland;" but, as a rule, the high functionaries of our professedly democratic Government receive more considerate treatment in this regard than some of their titled cotemporaries abroad. A few years ago, for instance, the tenants of a certain Italian estate refused to pay a special tax levied on it, and the local authorities, after searching the title, addressed their formal demand to the person they dis covered to be the owner of the property, as follows: "To Citizen Joachim Pecci; by trade or profession, Pope; conducting business, and also residing, at the Vatican Palace, Rome." And when the pope settled the bill, he was given a certificate beginning: "Received of Citizen Joachim Pecci,

The oddest objection raised to the substitution of electricity for hanging as a means of executing death sentences is that suggested by Dr. B. W. Richardson, of England, who thinks death would be made too attractive to the criminal classes by such a change from a barbaric to a civilized process. To carry out his theory to its legitimate conclusion, the Indian practice of tying a man to a stake, using him as a target for practicing with the bow and arrow, sticking forked skewers into his flesh and finally treating him to a slow roast would be preferable to any mode now in vogue in Christendom. There may be even more awful processes than this employed somewhere on the globe, but not yet recorded in books of travel; for the present, however, the Indian method will probably be disagreeable enough to satisfy even Dr. Richardson's thirst for horrors.

The changes proposed in the Senate bill to amend the interstate commerce law show that it s the purpose of the persons interested in that law to make it honestly effective, and not a mere nominal restriction upon the great carrying companies. The requirement of due notice of alterations in the schedule of rates will prevent a class of tricks which some of the corporations have been caught playing, and which have practically nullified the provisions against discrimination between favored shippers and the common run of mankind. The addition of imprisonment to certain penalties for gross violations of the law is wholesome also, for a mere fine ceases to exercise any terrors in cases where the profit to be made from defying authority is greater than the loss to be incurred by obeying it.

Mr. Ford's resolution, introduced in the House yesterday, to inquire into the alleged infractions of the laws against the importation of foreign pauper laborers under contract, promises to bring out some interesting facts, if current reports of the operations of emigrant agents and steamship companies are true.
