Is His Appointment a Violation of the Constitution?

A special dispatch to the Baltimore Sun from Charleston, S. C., yesterday, says: Mayor J. Adgar Smyth said today that if advised to do so by Corporation Counsel George H. Moffett he will apply to the United States courts for a restraining order prohibiting Dr. W. D. Crum from becoming collector of the port of Charleston until the constitutionality of his appointment can be tested.
