WILL RETURN TO TEXAS CONFEDERATE WAR FLAG Second Consecutive Victory in

After nearly fifty years the flag of the 17th and 18th Texas Cavalry, captured by Union soldiers during the C the Placer county high of Auburn, After nearly fifty years the flag of civil war, is to be returned to the

The flag, battle-scarred and bloodstained, is now in the possession of

stained, is now in the possession of John T. Callaghan, former commander of Camp No. 171, United Confederate Veterans, and was given to him recently by Mrs. Laura Clark, widow of Gen. William T. Clark, to turn over to Texas.

The flag was captured by the 15th Michigan Infantry of the 3d Brigade, 4th Division, 15th Army Corps, July 22, 1864, before Atlanta, Ga., after a desperate struggle in which the Texas troops were surrounded. With the flag seventeen officers and 165 men were captured.

Among the inscriptions on the flag are "Arkansas Post," "Chickamauga."

OVER SAFETY OF BRIDGE

Commissioners Say Aqueduct Structure Is Not Wide Enough to Accommodate Traffic.

There is no cause for apprehension over the safety of Aqueduct bridge, acording to a report sent to Congress by he District Commissioners in response to a resolution calling upon them for information as to the condition of this structure. The bridge is of sufficient strength for the loads carried upon it, but the width is not sufficient for

The report of the chief of engineers of the United States Army for the fiscal year 1912-13, it is stated. ontains a recommendation that an appropriation of \$19,000 be made for an propriation of \$10,000 be made for an investigation and preparation of plans for a bridge adequate to meet the traffic demands made upon the present one.
