

VIRGINIA HOUSE MEMBER TO MAKE 75 SPEECHES

Peery to Start Campaign in Ninth District Monday—Fight in Prospect.

RICHMOND, Va., September 3.—Representative George C. Peery of the ninth district will open his campaign formally Monday, at Jonesville, Lee County, and from that time will be on the stump every day, his schedule calling for 75 speeches before the election.
The Democrats of the State generally are massing their forces for the contest in the ninth, where for the first time in 20 years they were able to take charge last year.
Chairman Ryd of the State Democratic committee announces that the State Democratic committee will meet about the middle of the month. He had hoped to have the meeting the coming week, but this was impossible. For one reason Senator Glass is ill and it is deemed advisable to have him on hand when the committee meets.

WATER POWER SURVEY IS LAUNCHED IN VIRGINIA

Commission Named By Trinkle Organizes—Will Report In 1926.

LYNCHBURG, Va., September 3.—The water power and development commission named by Gov. Trinkle under an act of the last General Assembly, met here and organized for a survey of the State's available water supply, the object being to lay the report of the survey before the next General Assembly in 1926.
The members of the commission are J. R. Hershey of Appomattox, director and chairman; Dr. Thomas L. Watson of Charlottesville, State geologist and Dr. A. W. Drinkard of Blacksburg, director of the State agricultural experiment station. Dr. Watson was chosen secretary of the commission.

ELECTED IN LYNCHBURG.

Walker Pettyjohn Is Named Mayor by Council.

LYNCHBURG, Va., September 3.—The city council, at its organization meeting yesterday afternoon, elected Walker Pettyjohn mayor and Ernest Williams vice mayor for two years. E. A. Beck, city manager the last four years, was elected for a term of six years.
Heretofore, the council term has been four years, but under an amendment to the State law re-organization will take place every two years. To make this effective, lot was cast for long and short terms, the drawing being: Four years, Victor, Menefee and Williams; two years, Pettyjohn and Kinnier.

VIRGINIA IS HOLDING TAX HEARINGS FOR UTILITIES

Assessments for Coming Year to Be Based on Inquiry—Railroads First.

RICHMOND, Va., September 3.—The State Corporation Commission has begun the annual hearing of the State public utility companies relative to the assessment for the coming year. The commission has to pass on real estate and all other values to fix the amount of taxes to be paid. The first matter taken up was that of the steam roads. Under the law, the roads pay a franchise tax of 1 per cent on earnings, in lieu of license to operate.
The car-loading companies and other car companies were being heard today, with the electric railroads, light, heat and power companies and gas and water companies for tomorrow. The telephone, telegraph, canal lines, pilots, steamboats and motor vehicle carriers will wind up the hearing Friday. The assessments will have to be made at once.

DEATH OF MAN AND WIFE IS PROBED BY PARENTS

Another couple, not known to the Houghs, were with the man and woman killed, but are said to have escaped injury when the auto skidded and overturned.
