PARIS, France.—With the arrival of the holidays there was a general exodus of Americans from Europe homeward bound for the festivities, while incoming boats have been bringing hundreds of others here for the winter season along the Riviera in France and Italy and in Egypt and for the winter sports in Switzerland.
