WOMEN LAWYERS
HONOR DEARBILEY
Honor Guest and Speaker at
Dinner Given by Maryland Group.
Dean Grace Hays Riley was the guest of honor and speaker at the first dinner given by the Women Lawyers' Association of Maryland last week. He talked on the development and accomplishments of the Women's Bar Association of Washington. Miss Katherine Pike, professor of administrative law, and president of the National Women Lawyers' Association, is invited by the Maryland association to speak at the next meeting, to be held at the Hotel Rennett on June 6.

DANCE FOR HOLIDAY.
North Carolina Society to Observe
Mecklenburg Independence Day.
The North Carolina Society of Washington will observe its State legal holiday in commemoration of the signing of the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence, in 1775, Friday night at Meridian Mansions, 2400 Sixteenth street.
The celebration will be in the form of a dance, the proceeds of which will be turned over to the Red Cross for the benefit of flood sufferers. The dance hall and card reserve have been donated for the occasion by the management of Meridian Mansions.
It was originally planned to celebrate the holiday with a dinner and an address by Dr. Edwin A. Alderman, but the latter will be unable to attend on account of illness and a dance was substituted as the attraction. Since 1831, May 20 has been a legal holiday in North Carolina in commemoration of the adoption of the first resolutions in this country declaring independence of residents of Mecklenburg County from British rule.
