




President Coolidge passing through the streets of Havana with President Machado as cheering crowds turn out to welcome the American Executive on his arrival to address the Pan-American Con-

A hand-clasp of in-ternational friendship. President Machado is first to greet President Coolidge as he sets foot on Cuban soil.








