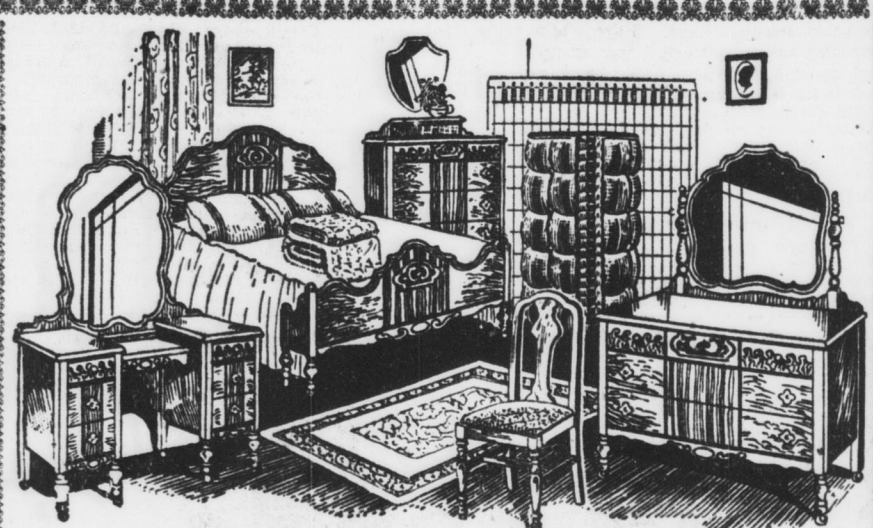

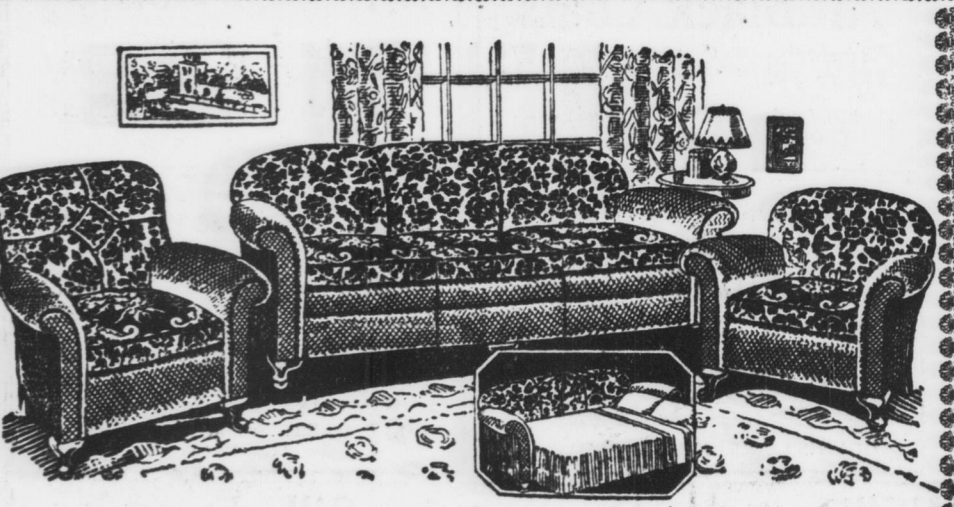

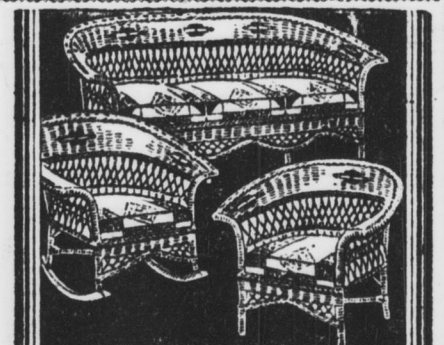

NEP MEN'S GOODS SEIZED FOR TAXES

Collections Playing Part in Redistribution of Wealth Within Soviet Union.

MOSCOW, U. S. S. R., February 15.—Tax collections are playing an important part in the redistribution of wealth within the Soviet Union. The recent energetic levying of taxes on persons engaged in private trade has already realized more than \$50,000,000, but the commissariat of finance is now revising those levies with a view to still larger revenues for the treasury.

Cash thus seized accrues directly to the treasury, but the clothing and chinaware and other household objects are being sold through government stores to trade unionists exclusively.

Thus many proletarians will wear clothes or use dishes and stoves once belonging to the nepe-men, while the happy dealers are now among Russia's poorest citizens, vying with the dispossessed kulaks or richer peasants in degree of poverty, and both classes have been evicted from their lodgings.

The original total levy on Moscow dealers was 3,000,000 rubles (\$4,500,000), but on reconsideration the commissariat of finance is raising its demands to 31,000,000 rubles (\$15,000,000) and a similar increase is effective everywhere.

Death Knell to Private Trading. Taxation, together with eviction from quarters, the withholding of goods for private merchandising and the denial of transportation of such articles on the railways has sounded the death knell for private trading. The commissariat of finance sees that the nepe-men business with a minimum of wealth in any form by taxation which is almost confiscatory in proportions.

Kulak wealth, however, goes to the kulaks themselves, and instead of to the national treasury and it helps finance the poorest peasantry during their first years of collective farming.

FORMER D. C. RESIDENT DIES IN CONNECTICUT

Jacob G. Cole Was Graduate of Old Columbian Law School.

Funeral services for Jacob G. Cole, 59 years old, formerly of this city, who died Thursday in Hartford, Conn., while on a business trip, will be conducted at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. Almee Wronker, No. 26 Beechwood terrace, Yonkers, N. At one time active in New York State politics, Mr. Cole had served as a member of the New York State Legislature and also as a member of the New York Civil Service Commission. He was a candidate for State treasurer on the Democratic ticket when former Gov. Alfred E. Smith was defeated by the Republican candidate, former Gov. Nathan L. Miller.

Mr. Cole was former treasurer of the Siegel-Cooper Co., which conducted a department store in New York. For the past several years he had engaged in the furniture business in Yonkers.

He was a graduate of the old Columbia Law School, now George Washington University. His surname had been changed from Cohen to Cole.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Ida Siegel Cole; his daughter, Mrs. Wronker of Yonkers; his son, Gary Cole, of Detroit; two brothers, Meyer Cohen of this city and S. M. Cole of Detroit, and four sisters, Mrs. Julius Selinger and Mrs. Alfred Selinger, both of this city, and Mrs. William Meyer and Mrs. Harry Pantiz of Baltimore.

Policyholders' Case Ended. DES MOINES, Iowa, February 15 (AP)—The Iowa Supreme Court today refused a rehearing of Albert P. Pratt's suit to restrain the Bankers' Life Co. of Des Moines from putting into effect increased assessments on holders of assessment policies.

In his petition, Pratt claimed that the company had used funds belonging to assessment policy holders in promoting legal reserve business.
