

UNOFFICIAL GLIDER MARK ESTABLISHED

Absence of Barograph Robs
Jack Barstow of New
World Record.

SAN DIEGO, Calif., May 1.—Failure to provide himself with a barograph yesterday robbed Jack Barstow, 24, of a new official world record for sustained flight in a glider after he had soared over point Loma for 15 hours and 13 minutes in a motorless sail plane, exceeding all previous glider endurance marks.
Barstow's remarkable performance will stand only as an unofficial record because of rules requiring that a barograph be installed in aircraft in order to gain official acceptance of new records.
The young glider expert announced, however, that if wind conditions are favorable, he plans to take the air again soon, this time with a barograph and attempt to set a new official mark.
Barstow took off at 12:44 p.m. (Pacific Standard Time) Tuesday in a new Bowls sail plane of 60-foot spread. He landed at 3:57 a.m. (Pacific Standard Time) yesterday, setting his powerless craft down within 500 meters of his point of take off. The records exceeded are:

SOVIET TO PUT WOMEN INTO WAR MACHINERY

Graduates of Technical Schools Would Be Eligible for Active Positions as Leaders.

BERLIN, May 1.—Soviet Russia's intention officially to absorb women into the machinery of warfare was an-

nounced in a report received here today from Moscow.
The Revolutionary War Board, the highest Soviet military authority, was said to have ordered the high command of the Red Army and the command of the military aviation section to draw up regulations for the acceptance of women in the military and technical schools.
Women graduates of these schools would be eligible to appointment to active positions in the following lines: Platoon commander, intelligence service,

army surveyor, commander of army radio stations and hospital service. In addition, after obtaining the necessary experience, women may be assigned to commanding posts in the "Oscaviaschm Society," which is concerned with problems of air warfare.

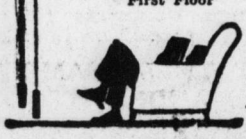

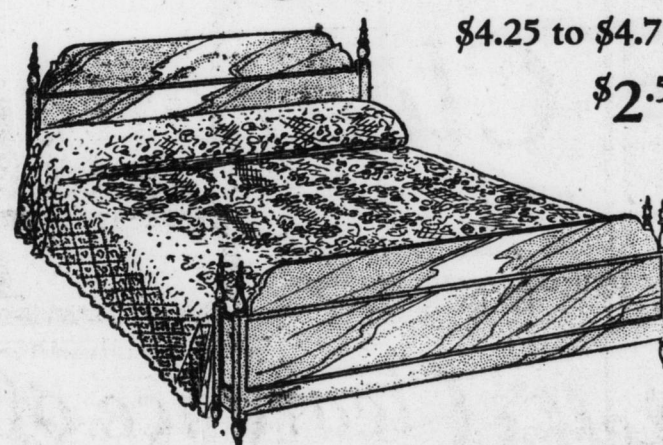
