OF STARS DETERMINED Pasadena Astronomers Use Eclipsing Stars in Discovery of

Distribution.

PASADENA, Calif., December 29 .-Using eclipsing stars, one 15,000,000 times as large as the sun, two Pasadena astronomers have succeeded in determining the distribution of chemical elements in a star's atmosphere.
