

LEADER OF SCOUTS TO INSPECT CAMP

Lord Baden-Powell, English
Group Founder, Coming
to Washington.

Lord and Lady Baden-Powell, accompanied by their two daughters, the Misses Heather and Betty Baden-Powell, will come to Washington next Wednesday to inspect the site of the national jamboree of the Boy Scouts of America, to be held here August 21 to 30.

Lord Baden-Powell, founder of the Boy Scout movement in England and known in Scout circles as "Chief Scout of the World," probably will return to Washington to attend the jamboree, which will bring more than 30,000 boys to the Nation's Capital. He and Mrs. Powell have been invited to be guests at the White House during the jamboree.

The national headquarters of the Scouts announced yesterday that word had been received that six Boy Scouts of American parentage, now living in China, will attend. Five of these boys were born in China and speak Chinese fluently, it was reported. The boys have already sailed, accompanied by eight others picked by the Chinese government to represent that country.

Pitching of tents on the Abingdon site Tuesday or Wednesday of this week will soon put that camp in readiness. Shower baths and sanitary facilities, including sewage systems, water systems and telephone lines, have been installed. This camp will accommodate 10,000 Scouts. Another 10,000 will be housed in a similar camp on Columbia Island and the third camp will be located in East Potomac Park, near Hains Point.

BROTHERS, ONE 14, HELD IN SLAYING

Bound Over to Grand Jury in
Death of Aged Farmer
From Gunshot.

ROCKY MOUNT, Va., July 13.—Two brothers, the younger 14 years old, were bound over to the grand jury today by Police Justice J. E. Allman on a charge of having slain Marsh Mullins, aged farmer, Tuesday night. Howard and Elsha Bowles, the former 14, claimed the shooting was accidental. They said Mullins got in the way of a shot intended for a rabbit. The shot was fired by Howard Bowles, police said.

Surella Young, near whose dwelling the shooting occurred, said the boys called Mullins from the rear of the house before the shooting. She said she did not hear any quarrel. Accused of firing into a moving automobile in the Endicott section Tuesday night, Garfield Wagner, 22, also was held for the grand jury. No one was injured by the shot.

FINANCIER'S MARRIAGE HAILED BY EX-WIFE

"We just happened to come back on the same plane and that's how it all started," Burns was quoted as saying. "I was terribly embarrassed. Really there's nothing to it."
