Winning Contract

BY THE FOUR ACES

(David Burnstone, Merwin D. Moler, Oswald Jacoby, Howard Schenken, world's leading team-of-four, inventors of the system that has beaten every other system in existence.)

Opening Two-Bid.

IN THE FOUR ACES' system there are two requirements for the opening two-bid: (a) A high-card holding of at least 13, except in the case of extremely freakish hands, in which it may be reduced to 11; (b) a probable playing strength of within one trick of game. At the same time when we make a two-bid we expect our partner to investigate slam possibilities thoroughly, and accordingly our hand must show such possibilities even though our partner may have very little strength.

While we open with two more often than most players, nevertheless even we have few two-bids, and when one comes along in a duplicate game, we are always gratified when our own theories work out well, as they did with the following hand:

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

South: \heartsuit A Q 10 7 4
 \spadesuit K 10 8 5 2
 \diamondsuit 8 7
 \clubsuit 9

North: \heartsuit J 8 6 3 2
 \spadesuit A J 7 4
 \diamondsuit Q 5
 \clubsuit 7 3

The south hand, with a high-card value of 11½ and two six-card suits, clearly qualifies as an opening two-bid under the Four Aces' system, and accordingly at most tables it was opened with a bid of two diamonds. North invariably responded with two spades. South bid three clubs, North three hearts, South four clubs, North

four hearts, South five clubs, North five diamonds—and there the bidding died.

However, when the South player opened with one only, the bidding invariably went something like the following (the opponents always passing):

South— North—

One diamond One spade

Three clubs Three hearts

Four clubs Four hearts

Six clubs Six diamonds

In other words, the players who opened with only one now felt they

had to bid the slam themselves, since otherwise they would not have shown their strength. The players who opened with two were content to stop at five only.

While the heart lead would actually defeat a game contract, five-odd was made at practically every table. But no one was able to make six. Hence, those players who failed to open with

two, as they should have, were properly penalized.
