AUTO POUND SUGGESTED FOR SCOFF-LAW DRIVERS

Safety Conference in New Jersey to Consider Plan Imposing Storage Tax on Violators.

NEWARK, N. J., July 23.-A suggestion that municipalities establish "automobile pounds" for cars of motorists convicted of traffic violations will be placed before an Essex County safety conference.

The "pound" idea, suggested to the freeholders, would make it necessary for the convicted motorist to pay, in addition to a fine, an impounding fee and a daily storage fee. Vacant lots, acquired through tax sales, would be used as "detention pens" to prevent motorists from using their cars during their suspension.


