Allocation Held Back. HSA, which disburses Chest funds to local hospitals, has held back a portion of the in-patient fund allocated to Children's because of the hospital's alleged failure to comply with an agreement calling for HSA certification of charity, or outpatients.

Willard C. Smith, HSA director, at a meeting last August, told Charles Drayton, president of the board of Children's Hospital that the funds were being withheld because the hospital was not returning to HSA all out-patient payments of more than \$1, as called for under the agreement.

Mr. Drayton, who also is chairman of the Hospital Presidents' Association, said yesterday he would appoint a committee consisting of himself, another hospital president and three superintendents, to draft a new agreement with HSA in an effort to iron out the difficulties.

The new agreement, he said, will be submitted for approval to a future meeting of the association before discussions looking toward its adoption are undertaken with HSA and Community Chest officials.


