## Jeep Is Latest Device to Carry 'Voice' Messages Overseas

The State Department is showing its newest bit of equipment to be used in spreading "The Voice of America." It is set up in the lobby of its main building, Twenty-first street and Virginia avenue N.W.

It is a jeep equipped with most of the modern means of communication except television. It is the first of 65 which will be sent out on the highways and byways of the free world to tell the American story.

The jeep cost about \$4,500 equipped and has a 3,000-watt generator operating off the motor to provide power for its movie and radio apparatus in villages where there is no electricity.

Mobile motion picture units were used first by the Office of Inter-American Affairs which equipped several medium sized trucks and

## 31 Carpenter Apprentices Complete Course Here

Thirty-one apprentices have graduated as carpenters in the Washington area through the Labor Department's Committee on Apprenticeship. Gino J. Simi, apprenticeship director for the District, announced yesterday.

The apprentices, most of whom are veterans, were trained by local union employers under the Carpenters District Council and Master Builders Association Joint Apprenticeship Committee program.

Certificates also have been presented to two apprentice mill-worker-cabinet makers and one apprentice floor coverer.

## D. C. Doctor Is First Negro To Get Cancer Fellowship

Dr. Jack E. White, chief resident in surgery at Freedmen's Hospital, has been awarded a \$2,500 fellowship appointment by the American Cancer Society to New York's Memorial Hospital for Cancer and Allied Diseases.

The award, presented to Dr. White by Dr. Harry H. Kerr, president of the society's District division, is the first such appointment to a Negro physician, officials said. It will finance a year's special study at the New York hospital.

Dr. White, 27, has been at Freedmen's since his graduation from the Howard University Medical School in 1944, with the exception of one year's service at the Marine Hospital, Boston. He lives at 51 Randolph place N.W. and will leave here for the appointment July 1.

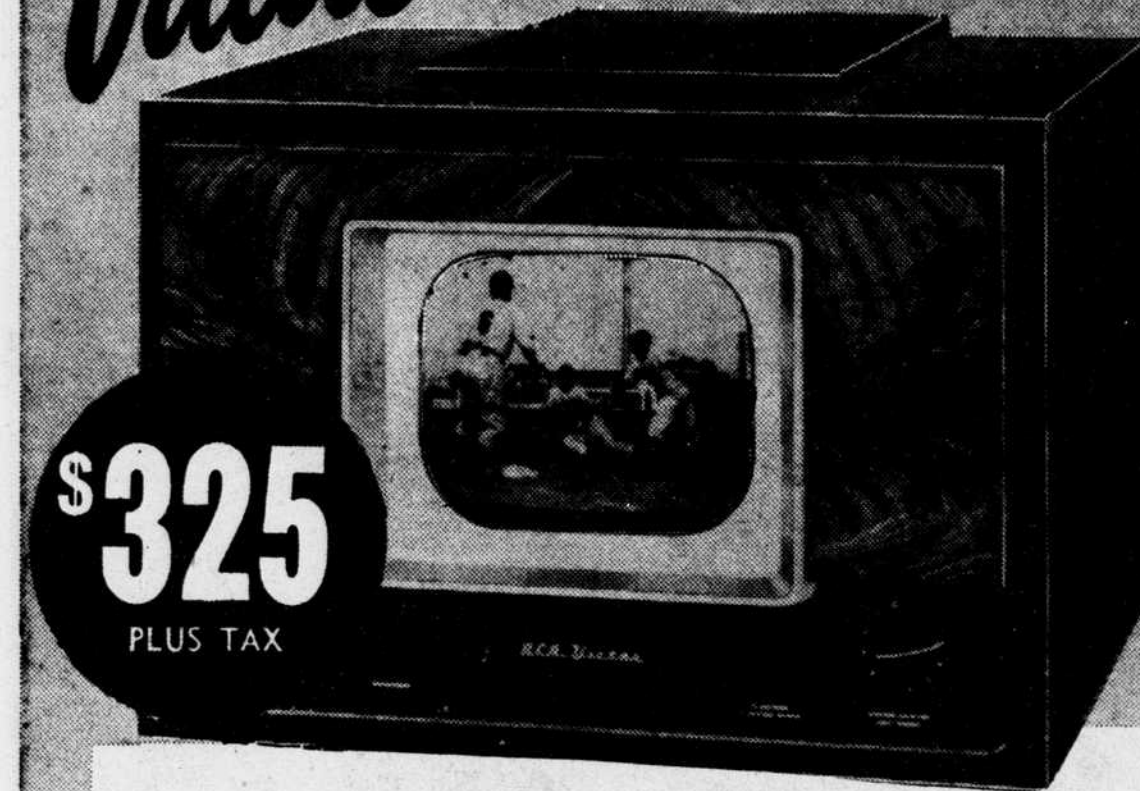

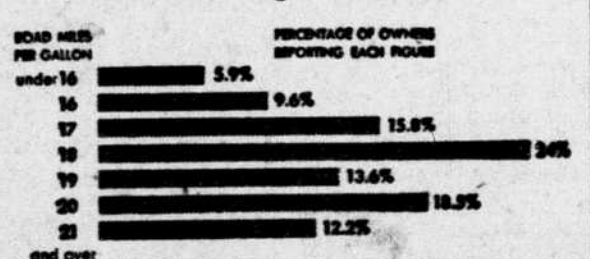
