

National Art Gallery to Display Priceless Austrian Collection

A priceless collection of art objects, assembled by the sovereigns of Austria over many centuries, is due to arrive at the Naval Gun Factory Sunday afternoon for display at the National Gallery of Art.

The collection, which will be placed on two months' exhibition at the gallery beginning November 20, is from the Kunsthistorisches Museum in Vienna, formerly the imperial museum of the Austro-Hungarian Emperors. The collection has been on a tour of Europe and was exhibited most recently in the Tate Gallery in London.

The collection is being brought to this country on the U. S. S.

U. N. Lack's Authority To Act on Reds' Trial Protest, Experts Say

NEW YORK, Oct. 18.—United Nations experts say the international agency cannot interest itself officially in the conviction of 11 American Communist leaders.

That was their reaction yesterday to the plan of Paul Robeson and Howard Fast, the author, to protest the jury trial to Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt's U. N. Commission on Human Rights.

Legal experts said the U. N. has no authority to act on personal protests and no right to interfere in the internal affairs of any nation.

Part of Three-Fly Move.
Robeson, Fast and other members of a leftist group said the U. N. protest was part of a three-pronged move to offset the verdict.

They said they also plan to raise bail in the hope of freeing the 11 jailed defendants and to extract from United States Attorney General J. Howard McGrath the promise that the Communist Party will not be driven underground.

Fast called a news conference in behalf of his group, "the National Non-Partisan Committee to defend the rights of the 12 Communist leaders."

Communist National Chairman William Z. Foster, the 12th leader, was not tried with the others. His health is bad.

Contrasted to Hitler.
Robeson described the trial, which ended Friday, as "American Fascism's effort to take over the world as Hitler did."

He added that it was important "to have the people understand that what happened to these men could happen to them."

The husky Negro baritone interrupted his remarks at one point to have a news photographer banished from the room. The photographer was trying to take pictures of Robeson talking.

"I don't want to be taken in action," Robeson complained.

The 11 Communists were convicted of conspiring to overthrow the United States Government by force. Their trial lasted nine months. They are due for sentencing next Friday.

The New York County (Manhattan) Lawyers' Association appointed a subcommittee yesterday to inquire into the conduct of the five defense lawyers at the conspiracy trial who were given jail terms by Judge Harold R. Medina for contempt of court.

All the contempt sentences are to begin November 15.

The judge sentenced Harry Sacher of New York and Richard Gladstein of San Francisco to six months; Abraham J. Isserman of Newark, N. J., and George W. Crockett, Jr., of Detroit, to four months; and Louis F. McCabe of Philadelphia to 30 days.

The investigating committee was named by George Trosk, chairman of the bar association's Committee on Discipline.

The association's board of directors, after receiving the committee's recommendations, will decide what action—if any—to take.

On the basis of any bar association action, New York courts could make recommendations to out-of-State bar associations concerning their lawyers.
