

VIENNA, Ga., Nov. 19 .- Georgia's 71-year-old senior Senator, Walter F. George, has announced his candidacy for re-election in 1950.

The chairman of the Senate Finance Committee made the announcement from his home here, thus dispelling rumors that he would retire. A leader of the so-called con-

servative Democratic faction, Senator George has been in the Senate since 1922. With the exception of the race

in 1938, when he was a target of a purge movement by President Roosevelt, he seldom has had strong opposition.
