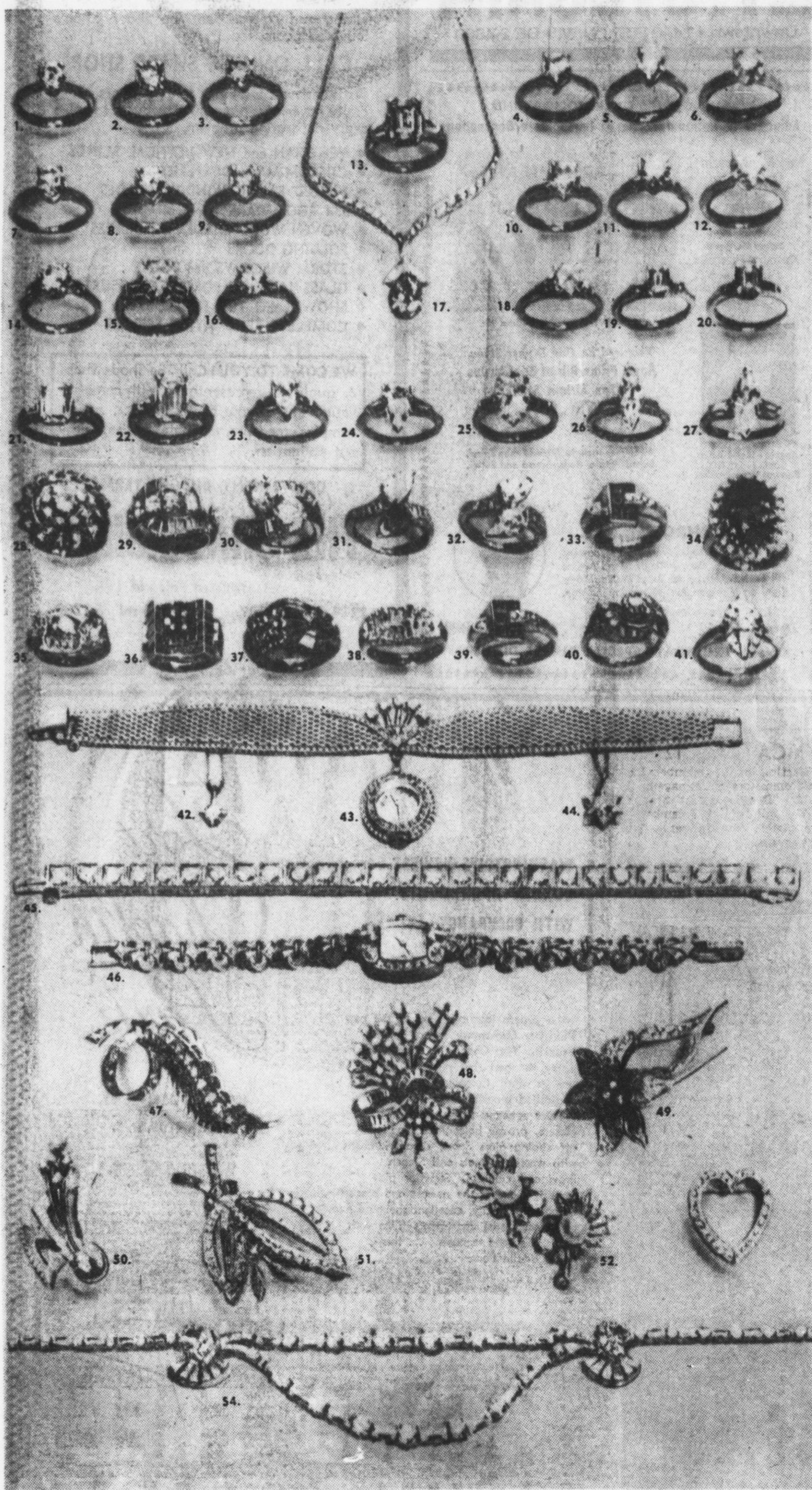

### Military Chiefs Going On Presidential Tour

he is expected about 8 p.m. Monday.

Mr. Hatcher said the President is making the trip to "pay a personal call to the officers and men alerted during the recent Cuban crisis."

"Many of these units will be returning to their home bases during the coming days," he said.

Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and all the chiefs of the uniformed services will join the President for the round of visits.

Gen. Taylor, Admiral Dennison and the chiefs of the various services are making the

entire trip with the President, starting out from Washington, Mr. Hatcher said.

At the first visit at Fort Stewart, the President is to inspect the troops and see a demonstration of armored units.

At Homestead the President will be met by all the generals in charge of the Cuban operations. With them he will see a demonstration by Air Force, Navy and Marine Corps units, will inspect Strategic Air Command reconnaissance aircraft, see a combat crew ready room and talk with pilots of high-altitude planes.

At Key West the President will visit the joint air defense center facilities and view a display of weapons and other equipment.

He will drive through Key West to see the Army's Hawk missile batteries and will inspect billets of troops assembled there.

He will inspect the naval base en route to the Boca Chica field to reboard his plane.

### Kennedy Skips Football Gets Medical Checkup

HYANNIS PORT, Mass., Nov. 24 (AP).—President Kennedy, who passed up attendance at a football game at his old alma mater, Harvard, because of threatening weather today had a visit from one of his doctors instead.

Dr. Hans of New York, who visited the President at the White House to check on his ailing back and to supervise therapy and exercise routines, flew up from New York, spent an hour with the President and then flew home.

Andrew T. Hatcher, assistant White House press secretary, said the visit had no connection with the President's decision to skip the Harvard-Yale game.

He said that since the President decided not to go to the game, Dr. Kraus was asked to come to Cape Cod for a routine checkup.

### Cuban TV Slates Talk by Mikoyan

KEY WEST, Fla., Nov. 24 (AP).—Havana Radio said tonight Soviet First Deputy Premier Anastas Mikoyan would bid farewell to the Cuban people tomorrow.

The announcement did not say just when Mr. Mikoyan planned to leave. The broadcast heard here said he would make his farewell appearance on television at 8 p.m.

Mr. Mikoyan arrived in Havana November 2, shortly after Russia decided to pull its missiles out of Cuba, on what was believed to be a fence-mending mission.

There has been no explanation for the prolonged length of his stay or official announcement on his discussions with Prime Minister Fidel Castro and other Cuban leaders.

Mr. Mikoyan yesterday visited easternmost Oriente Province and was greeted by Cuban Vice Prime Minister Raul Castro.

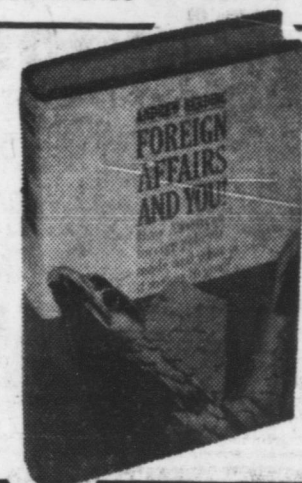

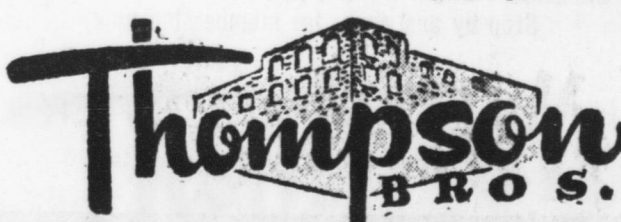
