## FARNUM FISH BREAKS WORLD'S RECORD

**Youngest Aviator Makes Best  
Time in 78-Mile Non-Stop  
Over-Water Trip from  
Chicago to Milwaukee.**

Milwaukee, Wis., May 25.—

By speeding from Chicago to Milwaukee over Lake Michigan in his aeroplane, a distance of 85 miles, Farnum Fish, America's

youngest licensed aviator, today broke the world's non-stop over-water record of 78 miles, held by Paulhan, the French aviator.

Fish left Cicero aviation field,

Chicago, at 11:05 a. m. He made a perfect landing at Lake Park at 1:25 p. m. A crowd of over 3,000 people cheered the intrepid youth as his machine settled to the ground. Strapped to his machine was a consignment of silk from a Chicago store to a local establishment. It weighed 300 pounds.

Fish is the youngest licensed aviator in America. He is 18 years old. He recently gained notoriety here by volplaning from a dizzy height when caught in an air pocket, landing in Grant Park. He was arrested for violating a Chicago ordinance prohibiting aviators alighting in public parks.

## LONDON, IN STRIKE GRIP, FACING FAMINE

**Price of Food Starts Upward—  
Ships and Docks Loaded  
With Rotting Eatables,**

London, May 25.—The great strike of the 100,000 dock workers of London was added to today by the walkout of the Carters' Union. Before evening there were 130,000 men on strike.

The price of food already has begun to go up, and famine is
