MERCEDES CAR LEADS IN AUTOMOBILE RACE

DePalma Driving 82 Miles an
Hour—Ormsby Withdraws.

Indianapolis, Ind., May 30.—
At 10:02 Anderson, driving a
Stutz car, whirled across the
starting line in a cloud of smoke
80 miles an hour, and the 500-mile
motor classic of America was on.
The other entries followed at one-
minute intervals.

Tezlaff in a Fiat jumped into
the lead, followed by DePalma in
a Mercedes. Time first lap,
1:43:43. Same positions for three
laps.

DePalma in lead, fourth lap,
Wishart, Mercedes, second; Tez-
laff, third.

At 80 miles, DePalma first;
Dawson, second. Time 83:33.

Ormsby in Opel quit in fourth
lap; engine trouble.

WILBUR WRIGHT DIES— FAMOUS AVIATOR

Father, Sister and Three Brothers
at His Bedside.

Dayton, O., May 30.—Follow-
ing a slight rally, during which
he took nourishment, Wilbur
Wright, world's famed inventor
aviator, died at 3:15 this morning
of typhoid fever. His end came
peacefully, and he was surround-
ed by members of his family.

Wilbur Wright was the son of
