

"I don't see how any men could kill little children like my William and them other poor little things who were shot or burned."

The man who led the uniformed gunmen at the start of the battle was E. K. Lenderfelt, a lieutenant in the Colorado National Guard. A. C. Felts,

head of the Baldwin-Felts detective agency, told the congressional investigation committee that Lenderfelt operated a machine gun for the coal mine owners during the earlier part of the strike.
