SOUTHERN CHICKEN

An old fowl makes a very nice dish prepared in this way.

Single and joint a stewing chicken. Put into iron or granite kettle with just enough hot water to cover (four or five cups). Add one even tablespoon of minced pork cut in small pieces, one stalk of celery cut in small pieces. Allow this to simmer for three or four hours, or until the chicken is very tender. When ready to serve add salt, if necessary. Have broth enough for gravy. For one chicken there should be four cups. Thicken with two tablespoons of flour blended with cream or milk. Boil ten minutes and serve hot with baked sweet potatoes.

PICKLED BEETS
