BROTHER KILLED IN DUEL WITH TWO SISTERS

Sterling, Ill., July 10.—Mrs. Lee Hutton and Miss Lillian Meyers, sisters, are held without bail for grand jury pending investigation of killing of their brother, Emanuel Meyers, late yesterday.

According to story told by Meyers as he was dying, partly corroborated by the sisters, the three had been dis-

puting.

One of the sisters drew a revolver from the folds of her dress and opened fire on the brother. She fell fainting and the other sister took the weapon. Meyers fell with four bullets in his body.
