KAISER DECLARES WAR ON BELGIUM —ITALIAN ARMY MAY REVOLT

**Naval Engagement Reported in North Sea—German
Army of 100,000 Headed Toward French
Border to Help Advance Guard.**

*Chicago banks received from Washington \$54,000,-
000 made available by secretary of treasury. Believed
financial situation will now be restored to normal.*

*Brussels, Aug. 4.—Belgium has opened negotiations
with France and England for alliance against Germany.*

*London.—Premier Asquith told house of commons
Germany's answer to English note demanding explanation
of invasion of Belgium was not satisfactory. War
talk loud among members of parliament.*

*Berlin, Aug. 4.—Placing responsibility for the break
directly at France's door Germany today formally de-
clared war on her neighboring republic.*
