## GERMANS CAPTURE GREAT FRENCH FORTRESS---40,000 PRISONERS

Kaiser's Biggest Victory Since War Started—Two German Merchantmen Sunk—Adrianople Facing Famine—Troops in Revolt.

Berlin, Sept. 9.—War office announces the capture of the great French fortress of Maubeuge with four generals, 40,000 prisoners and 400 guns, the single greatest German success since the opening of the war.
