## GERMAN RETREAT CHECKED—LEFT WING OF AUSTRIANS PENNED IN

Army of Crown Prince Driven Back—Heavy Fighting  
Still On In France, With General Result Still  
In Doubt—Sweeping Victories for  
Both Sides Reported.

*Berlin, Sept. 15 (via Wireless to the United Press  
Through Sayville, L. I.)—It was officially announced by  
the general staff today that heavy fighting still continues  
in France, with the general result still in doubt.*

*Trieste, Austria, via Rome.—The Trieste and Trient  
regiments which were sent to the front in Galicia have  
been decimated. Most of these regiments were made up  
of Italians from the Austrian provinces that are settled  
by the Italians.*
