## AMERICAN WOMEN FOR CHINAMEN TRAFFIC SHOWN UP BY POLICE

*Twenty-Second St. Chinaman Fined After Policewomen  
Are Offered "Escorts" In His Saloon—"Es-  
corts" Sought by Police—"Mum's the  
Word" In Chinatown.*

White girls for yellow men. American women for Chinamen. That's the traffic of a Chinese saloon at 223 W. Twenty-second street, according to the police.

A squint-eyed Oriental who keeps a list of Chinamen that will pay well for American girls—he's the bartender at the saloon.

He drew a \$10 fine in the Morals Court for attempting to "furnish escorts" for two policewomen who entered the saloon Wednesday night.

The girls walked into the cafe behind the Chinese saloon and ordered beer from Tom Lee, the bartender.

Tom grinned as he politely bowed to the two white girls.

"I can't serve the white ladies unless they get an escort," he said. "Women without men—no good. Get man—all right."

The girls said nothing, but arose to leave the place. The Chink, they claim, placed himself in front of them,
