AMAZING REPORT SHOWS JOHN D. CONTROLS CHICAGO MONEY

Rockefeller Foundation Has \$100,000,000 in 160 Cor-
porations—Chicago Street Car Lines and Kohl-
saat's Restaurants Are Among the
Sources of Wealth

When you get on a Chicago street car and hand the conductor a nickel for the fun of hanging to a strap and getting your toes stepped on, then—

Part of your nickel goes back and ends up in the moneybags of John D. Rockefeller or one of his charities or foundations.

When you go into a Kohlsaat restaurant, eat a cheese sandwich and hand the cashier a dime, then—

Part of your dime goes back and ends up in the moneybags of John D. Rockefeller or one of his charities or foundations.

The foodships carrying flour to the Belgians, the \$240,000 refuges in

Louisiana for saving the beautiful southern wildbirds, the \$140,000 for studying how the hookworm makes people lazy down in Alabama — all these charities have been paid for in part by Chicago straphangers, Chicago patrons of the Kohlsaat restaurants and Chicago customers of other enterprises in which Rockefeller money is invested.

The U. S. industrial relations commission received today a published statement of the Rockefeller foundation. It shows over 160 corporations in which the Rockefeller foundation had \$100,000,000.

Straphangers may have slight in-
