COURT BLOCKS FIGHT ON SCHOOL TEACHERS

Judge Sullivan Refuses to Dissolve Injunction Against Loeb Rule—Says Federation's Enemies Are Strangely Silent in Court.

The teachers' union won again. Judge Sullivan in the superior court today turned down the Jake Loeb bunch of the school board when they asked to have the injunction against the Loeb rule dissolved.

"Nothing has been shown in the trial of this case which would tend to prove that the Chicago Teachers' Federation has a harmful influence on the school system," declared the judge when he ruled.

"The rule itself says that the federation operates against the good interests of the schools, but the plaintiffs have introduced nothing to prove it."

In other words, while the Loeb faction have through its mouthpieces, the Baldwin committee and the trust press, friends of the interests which the teachers fought, have been slapping charge after charge at the union, not a piece of evidence was brought into court to prove these statements.
