RICHEST COP IN CHI. LANDS JOB TODAY

Nick Hunt Goes On as Detective Chief—Has a Lot of
Mazuma—Famous as a Strikebreaker—\$5,000
Check From Og Armour?

Nick Hunt took oath of office today as chief of detective bureau.

Naming of Hunt by Mayor Thompson, along with the endorsement of Hunt by Chief Healey, breaks all records in the Chicago police department in three particulars:

1. Hunt is the wealthiest policeman who ever wore a star in Chicago. The Tribune says he is "reputed the owner of a million dollars' worth of realty and other property." The Herald says Hunt is taxed on about \$100,000. ~~Anyway, he has~~

trots more ready cash than any cop-
per Chicago has ever seen.

2. Hunt is the first professional strikebreaker to get on as detective chief. Since he quit the force in 1911 under fire he has operated the Shippy, Hunt & Dorman agency. It supplied "guards" for the waitresses' strike of 1914, the car strike last June, and a crew of "guards," two of them known sluggers, for the Royal Tailors' shop in the garment strike.

3. Hunt is the first detective chief to come back to a high job after having quit the force without standing trial on charges of misconduct. ~~Sometimes they come back with~~
