MANDEL SUB-BASEMENT BRANDED MENACE TO SAFETY OF PUBLIC

**Architest Says Eastland Disaster and Iroquois Fire
Should Be Warning—Under Surface Salesroom
Risks Similar Catastrophe—Sexton Defends
Proposal—Up to Council Tomorrow.**

Will the council of Chicago risk wholesale murder in department store basements simply because department stores are big advertisers and can make the newspapers keep their mouths shut?

That's a question for council to answer. All the power of the enormous pull of the State street stores is being used to whip council into line to give Mandel Bros. a special permit to violate the law.

"We have the Eastland disaster and the Iroquois fire to warn us, so we go into this question of legalizing a sub-basement as a salesroom with our eyes open," said Richard E. Schmidt, an architect who was one of the speakers who debated the Mandel Bros. sub-basement ordinance before the City club yesterday.
