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GUARDING LIBERTY WITH DARK LANTERN. - The knockout of civil service effected by the Jake Loeb majority of the school board through incidental use of the religtous issue is the deadlest blow that has been struck at the public school system of Chicago in many years.

Besides taking a big smash at merit rule, the Jake Loeb majority has gone further yet as an enemy of liberty through its refusal to let the aldermen of the council schools committee scrutinize certain school

board records.

Liberty and democracy have always made their battles in the open. The enemies of liberty in business, politics and religion always work in the dark. They don't want daylight. They must screen their operations from general public view. They're doing it now in their refusal to supply aldermen with specific facts asked for.

In the midst of all the hot charges and countercharges of recent days. notice the strong, quiet, intelligent argument and plea from the committee organizing the Public Education

ass'n:

"We urge the board of education to withdraw, at the request of disinterested citizens, from the position which it has recently taken of cutting out the merit clause from the rules governing the reappointment of teachers. We urge as a substitute

measure the setting up within the superintendent's office of an adequate system for the testing and promotion of effective work in the schools, and the use of the entire experience and intelligence of the teachers and the community.

"We believe that the board of education will have the support of all those sincerely interested in the publie schools, if such a system is adopted and enforced without discrimination against teachers because of their membership in any organization, or because of their religious or

political affiliations."
