CORPORATION IMMUNITY FROM LIBEL ARGUED

Hearing on Chicago Tribune Case Adjourned.

CHICAGO, Sept. 24.—Arguments on the demurrer of the Chicago Tribune to the \$10,000,000 libel suit filed against it by the city of Chicago were not completed today, Judge Harry M. Fisher granting a request of Chester E. Cleveland, special counsel for the city, that court adjourn at noon.

Mr. Cleveland today addressed himself to a question asked by Judge Fisher yesterday, as to whether a municipal corporation was to be treated as a private corporation or a governmental body in cases where its general administration was affected and some of its property rights only incidentally.

Mr. Cleveland said the answer to this query would come from consideration of the nature of the action for libel as it was capable of enforcement by corporations.

MOTION TO APPEAL SPEED CASE GRANTED

Charles Connor Fights Charge and Traffic Court Fine.

A motion for an appeal made by Charles Connor, a lawyer, with offices in the Metropolitan Tower, who was charged with speeding on Fifth avenue, has been granted by Judge Muirhead in General Sessions.

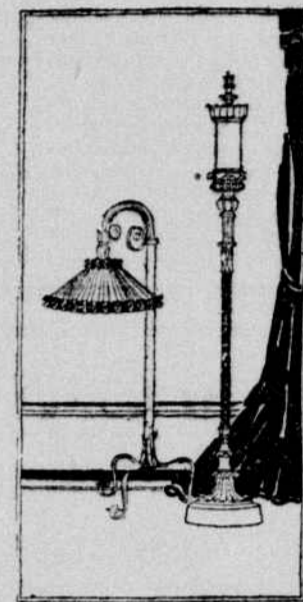

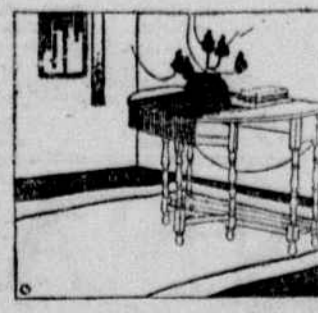
