PARIS, May 13 (Associated Press).—The American Embassy is forwarding to the United States in a diplomatic pouch the documents filed with it by Mme. Liobov Mouronsky, who claims to be the first and only legal wife of Anastase Vonsiatsky, who was recently married in the United States to Mrs. Marion Buckingham Rear-Stephens of Chicago.

"I am not after money," Mme. Mouronsky declared. "I want redress and I want this man punished for ruining the best years of my life." Mme. Mouronsky, who said she would be accompanied by her father, is understood to have taken passage on the steamship Rochambeau, sailing from Havre next Tuesday.

RUBINSTEIN OPERA, 'THE DEMON,' PRODUCED HERE BY RUSSIANS

Work's Resemblance to 'Faust' Does Not Prevent Considerable Individuality. By W. J. HENDERSON.

Anton Rubinstein's opera, "The Demon," was produced at the New Amsterdam Theater yesterday afternoon by the Russian Opera Company. This type of drama was introduced to the world as long ago as 1855 and the most cursory reading of historical records suggests that it has been dead most of that time.
