CHICAGO, Jan. 1.—Jewelry valued at \$10,000 was taken from Mr. and Mrs. William Feldman who were also beaten by three young men who robbed them as they returned to their apartment from a New Year's celebration early this morning. Fred Pancer, 21, son of a wealthy machine manufacturer, and friend of the Feldman family, was later arrested and confessed. He implicated Paul Taxman, 18, and Samuel Feldman, 19, as his companions. The jewelry was recovered.

Mrs. Feldman is in a serious condition from the beating administered when she resisted. The trio had obtained entrance to the apartment and attacked the owners when they entered.

## GILA RIVER TO BE BRIDGED BY U. S. ROAD AID

(By Dispatch A. P. Wire)

PHOENIX, Jan. 1.—Among the projects to be built in Arizona during the year of 1926 with federal aid funds from the \$1,055,06 allotted to Arizona by the bureau of public roads, will be the bridge over the Gila river below the Gillespie dam on the Phoenix-Yuma road.

Bids for this bridge will be opened on January 18 by the state highway department. It is one of the most important bridges to be erected in the state as it will eliminate the closing of the Phoenix-Yuma road in times of flood on the Gila river.

A number of other projects are contemplated in the state with the federal aid funds, it is stated. These include the improvement of several stretches of the seven per cent system of national roads of the which at present are unimproved and which when improved will link the system of good roads together.

The federal aid to be obtained by the state from the government must be matched with state funds, on the ratio of about 72 per cent federal aid to 28 per cent state funds. Arizona is one of the states of the Union which receives a large ratio of federal aid.

## Albuquerque Newspapers Combined Under Single Management; Print Both

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Jan. 1.—The Albuquerque Morning Journal and Albuquerque Herald were combined under one management here today. The two newspapers will, as heretofore, be published under their respective names, the Journal as a morning newspaper and the Herald as an evening newspaper. They will be published from the plant of the Journal. T. M. Pepperday, who was president of the Herald, is publisher of the two newspapers, H. P. Pickrell, who was editor of the Herald, is editor of both newspapers and J. Landis Wilson, advertising manager, according to an announcement to be published in The Morning Journal tomorrow.

The Morning Journal has been published in Albuquerque for more than 40 years. For years it was the only newspaper in this part of the southwest to carry a full Associated Press report, and is the only morning newspaper in New Mexico. The Herald, too, has a long history, being the successor of a pioneer paper called the Evening Citizen and later the Tribune-Citizen. Both papers are members of The Associated Press. The reorganization of the Morning Journal publishing company was effected with the following officers:  
T. M. Pepperday, president; Q. Landis Wilson, vice president; H. P. Pickrell, secretary. The directors are T. M. Pepperday, A. C. Pepperday and H. P. Pickrell.

## WALL STREET BRIEFS

(By Dispatch A. P. Wire)

NEW YORK, Jan. 1.—The New York cotton exchange and all other commodity markets will be closed tomorrow, having taken a three-day recess until Monday. The New York stock exchange, the curb market, the consolidated stock exchange and banking institutions will be open for the usual half day.

In the annual summary of the national electric railway and bus situation, Lucius S. Storrs, managing director of the American Electric Railway association, finds that 1925 has been marked by distinct progress in the local transportation industry. Electric car and bus service, he says, is being rapidly co-ordinated under single managements in most communities, electric lines are being modernized, credit is being slowly restored, and the public, realizing the necessity for good common carriers' service under responsible electric railway agencies, is showing an increasing desire to work with local managements in solving current problems.

**RHINE 30 FEET ABOVE NORMAL ON FRIDAY**  
COBLENZ, Germany, Jan. 1.—The Rhine river was higher today than at any time since the floods of 1784. The high water mark is 9.30 metres (about 30 feet) above normal.
