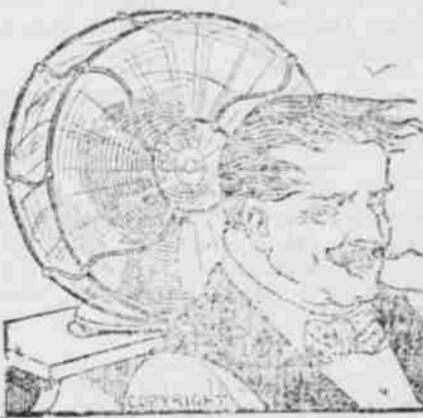

DEMOCRAT'S MARE'S NEST

The Manner of Paying Off the City Employees.

The Arizona Democrat seems to have it in for John T. Dennis, the republican member of the city council from the First ward. It printed a story on Sunday morning accusing Mr. Dennis of being a grafter, alleging that he had employed a lot of Mexicans to work for the city and had them paid off weekly at the Boston store. The proprietors of the Boston store happen to be tenants of Mr. Dennis and it was intimated that this arrangement had been made by him in their interest.

Ever since the city has been employing laborers one place of business or another has had to pay them off for the reason that most of them could not wait until the end of the month when the bills should be audited, for their pay. It has never been understood that the laborers should take their pay in merchandise and there was no understanding of that kind while the Boston store was paying them off. Some of them would naturally trade there as they would have traded anywhere they might have been paid. But not one dollar in five of the amount paid out was spent there. The pay roll would some times amount to as much as \$500. The proprietors of the store would have to do without the use of the money until the next meeting of the council and the interest on it would frequently amount to more than the profit on the goods sold to the employees.

There never was any understanding between Mr. Dennis and the proprietors of the store. It was merely a convenient arrangement for the city and for the employees. It had been the practice for the city to issue a time check covering all the wages due the men and the check would be taken up by the store which happened to be doing the paying off. The store could not afford to deal with the separate checks. By reason of the complaint made by the Democrat the council has ordered that separate checks shall now be issued and the men have to peddle them around town and hunt for merchants who are willing to wait until the end of the month for their money. Many of the merchants will not bother with the checks at all.

RETURNED IN TRIUMPH

Coronado Beach, June 18.—Amid the plaudits of several hundred Coronadans and Tent City tourists the famous band returned today from its triumphant tour. Wherever it appeared it was rapturously received, and one continued ovation marked its way. Most generous has been both press and populace and the scheme while novel and with out precedent will be the greatest advertisement Tent City and Southern California have ever had.

Everything was in prime readiness for their return. Everywhere was seen the National emblem, and all buildings were in gala attire, flags of many different nations being cast to the breeze, while the presence of nature's choicest productions in variety and profusion were used alike on both interior and exterior of buildings, making a most beautiful picture.

In the evening amid the glare of electric lamps and a spectacular display of fireworks, the opening concert was given, which was received with every demonstration of popular approval. Where every number was rendered with consummate skill, it were difficult to particularize, but the two soloists, Mr. Paulsch with the cornet, and Mr. Bennett with the trombone attracted the greatest share of attention. The Tent City band on this occasion simply surpassed itself, the playing being by far the best ever heard here, and was listened to by about 5,000 people.

Following the concert came the ballroom, the floating casino. The gathering was large, the music excellent, and the occasion delightful.

Mr. Weiss, who accompanied the band as lecturer, speaks in unqualified terms of the treatment accorded, and of the responsiveness of all classes of people. He states that in the 5,000 miles traveled over Colorado, Kansas, Indian Territory, Oklahoma, Missouri, New Mexico, Arizona, Texas and Southern California, that the trip was one continued ovation.

Their audiences, said Mr. Weiss, ranged from 3,000 to 10,000—the last named being at Colorado Springs—and the number of pieces of literature distributed exceeded half a million. Mr. Weiss is the city passenger agent of the Santa Fe in Cincinnati, and his services during the trip were simply invaluable. On Tuesday evening, Director Ohlmeyer will conduct another concert. With such an auspicious opening, the festivities of the season will begin in real earnest.

The Cafe opened today, tallyho parties have already begun, daily trips to Coronado Islands, sixteen miles distant, will begin next week, and the new ferry boat, Ramona, will arrive before the first of next month. Tourists are now coming rapidly and soon every foot of space will be taken. The weather is delightful, and all omen point to the largest attendance in the history of Tent City. The states represented in addition to California are: Colorado, Pennsylvania, New York, Ohio, Michigan, Illinois, Iowa, Kentucky, Kansas, Texas, North Dakota, Minnesota, the territories of New Mexico and Arizona, and England and Scotland.
