



Other articles which show striking increases during the decade are patent medicines, of which the exports advanced from \$3,500,000 to \$7,000,000; furs and fur skins, from \$6,000,000 to \$19,000,000; boots and shoes from \$6,-500,000 to \$18,000,000; India rubber manufactures (produced from material brought from other parts of the world), from \$4,500,000 to \$14,000,000; and silk manufactures (also produced from imported material), from \$500,000 to \$2,500,000. Exports of eggs, despite the advance in prices in the domestic markets, increased from 1,500,000 dozen in 1903 to 21,000,000 dozen in 1913.
