Big Colfax County Mining Camp Wil Soon Number 10,000 Inhabitants.

The growth and increase of population of Dawson, the big coal camp in Colfax County and the terminus of the Dawson Railroad is given by the Raton Range in a news item that certainly contains good news. The Range

"Among the many towns in the Ter ritory that are growing rapidly is the thriving mining camp of Dawson. which already claims a population of 6,000, and also that it will not be long before it attains a population of 10,-000, and that it will rival Albuquerque in size and number of industries.

"The purchase of the El Paso and Southwestern Railroad by the Phelps-Dodge people and the great increase that will be made in the monthly coal production, and the increased number of miners that will be given employment, will all prove a stimulus to the growth of the place.

"According to the school census of Dawson, 600 children attend the public schools there out of a school population of 800. A superintendent and seven teachers are employed in the

"In addition to the above, the general offices of the Dawson Fuel Company have been moved from El Paso to Dawson, causing an increase in population of thirty people. The fuel company has just completed a large and handsome office building, which has been fitted up for general office purposes and the force has already


