MALLEABLE GLASS.—It is evident to all that a method which would result in rendering glass malleable and ductile would be a wonderful and valuable advancement in art. Such a method it is believed has been perfected to such an extent that glass can be hammered and drawn out as iron or copper and the most delicate articles resist breakage as well as those metals. We have had translated for us, says the Deer Lodge, Montana, *New North-West*, by Mr. Peter Valiton, Esq., an article from *Le Liberal de l'Est*, Belfort, France, Oct. 8th, 1874, giving the history of this great achievement. M. de La Batie, a wealthy gentleman of Chateau Richemont in the Commune de Brioy has been conducting experiments at his chateau for the past five or six years and has had engaged with him one of the eminent chemists of France. M. de La Batie and his assistant labored assiduously in the face of many almost unsurmountable obstacles, the chemist at one time abandoning the work as impossible. The former, however, persisted, and his companion, re-inspired by his faith, joined in a new series of experiments which resulted in the fullest success. Large works were erected in the chateau and they manufacture numerous articles, from immense plates for facing houses, to every variety of cooking utensils. The plates for houses are spiked or bolted to the masonry like iron, and are practically indestructible. Cooking utensils resist the action of heat as well as any earthenware or metal, and a watch crystal thrown upon a pavement will not break. They have taken out a patent on the invention, are receiving large orders from France, Europe and America, and have now constructed on the river Suran a building 489 feet front costing 625,000 francs especially for the manufacture of malleable glass-ware, and fitted up with every requisite for the business. Just think of this in the great items of lamp chimneys and window glass, of the house-wife watching the progress of her dinner cooking in crystal vessels, of houses faced with indestructible material susceptible of a finer polish than marble, of the finest and most enduring colors and the brightening up of which will only require a spray of water, beside the other thousand practical uses to which it can be applied. Having seen no previous mention of this article which is destined to figure so prominently in the arts and manufactures we have given it this extended mention, and hope at an early day to see it entered on the list of Montana importations.

COUNTRY JOURNALISM.—Since writing a paragraph on this subject, which appears elsewhere, we have read an editorial on the same subject in this morning's *Chronicle*. The lesson which it seeks to draw from the death of the *Benicia Tribune* seems to be, that since the establishment of railroads a paper in a country town is unnecessary. Inferentially the inhabitants ought to subscribe for the *Chronicle* and let their local organ die. The fact of the matter is that there is not a paper in San Francisco that will assist in any way to build up an interior town. On the other hand a bright editor properly sustained by the inhabitants can make a town. Does any one deny that the amusing nonsense published by Bailey has had an effect on the prosperity of Danbury? Danbury is known to a great many as the place where the Danbury *News* is published. Not long ago a man worth considerably over a million in money and land, pulled a Kansas paper out of his pocket, and pointing to the name at the head of the column, said: "I depend entirely on that man to make the property I own in this place valuable." A country paper might be as pleasing to the inhabitants of San Mateo, San Jose, Grass Valley, Marysville, Placerville, Los Angeles, or other interior towns as one filled with the scandal of the metropolis can be. The natural advantages of the surrounding country afford as pleasing a text as a murder in a dive or the latest discoveries of fraud among city officials. The country newspaper is a great advertisement for the town in which it is published, and it is to the interest of every inhabitant to contribute to its support.

BEWARE OF ALMOND ROCK.—Many and many are the shoals and quicksands which beset the ocean of life; many and dangerous the hidden rocks lying in wait for the badly-steered or tempest-tossed vessel. There are the rocks of our childhood, of our youth, our manhood, and our old age, and lucky is he who runs his course with a fair wind and never scrapes his keel. Lucky, for the most deadly of all dangers awaits him at the very outset of his voyage. The rock of his childhood is a fair and tempting structure which lures him to his fate with a power rarely to be resisted.
