New York, Nov. 18, 1850.

GENTLEMAN.—The news from Europe yesterday, by Steamer Atlantic, has had no effect upon our Markets. The Cambria has been eleven days out from Liverpool, and is now due at Halifax. As our merchants preferred to export specie in payment of their Foreign debts, rather than pay the price asked for sterling bills—London bills have fallen to 10 per cent premium. However, I should not be surprised at a rise, as there is a great drain upon this market for bullion, demanded in other sections. Large amounts of specie are on their way to New Orleans, to serve probably as the basis of the Tehuantepec Rail Road Company, or the new line of Steamers which are to be built to run between New Orleans and New York once a week. Last Friday the senior member of the great firm of Corcoran & Riggs, applied to Stimson & Company's New Orleans and New York Express, to convey one million dollars in specie, from this city to the former place. There is every indication of a rapid growth for New Orleans, and I regard real estate property in that quarter, as worth at least 20 per cent more than it was last summer.

The Steamer Empire City sailed for Chagres, this afternoon, taking a large number of passengers, and an immense amount of freight. The Senate, 9 Whigs, 10 opposition. The Republicans states however, that in Benton, [a Whig given in the returns] the election will be contested; that much doubt exists as to the result in Hillsborough, where two Democrats contest the election, and by throwing out two illegal precincts, may elect their Whig opponent.
