ANOTHER AGRICULTURAL CAR.

Rock Island to Run "Follow Up" Car Supplementing and Enlarging on Work Done by Recent Hog and Corn Special.

The Times has been favored by Mr. Chas. B. Sloat, A. G. P. A., of the C. R. I. & P. R. R. with a copy of the flyer being sent out advertising a Follow Up Agricultural Car, which will cover the territory gone over recently by the Hog and Corn Special. As Mr. Sloat says, "the element of time was the only drawback to the operation of the former special train, but we think the long stops of the 'follow up' car fills the gap."

The car will be at Forrest City on Tuesday, April 25, from 9 a. m. to 1:30 p. m. Other stops in St. Francis county will be: Wheatley, Monday, April 24, 9:15 a. m. to 1:30 p. m.; Palestine, Wednesday, April 26, 10 a. m. to 1:30 p. m.; Goodwin, Thursday, April 27, 9 a. m. to 1:30 p. m.

There will be special lectures on dairy farming, Prof. H. S. Mobley, Special Agent U. S. Department of Agriculture; Prof. J. M. Wilson, Arkansas Agricultural College; County Farm Demonstration Agent, J. P. Paine; secretary and treasurer State Farmers Union, expert Sweet potato grower, and other farming experts will hold meetings at the car at each of the stops.

A fine exhibition of corn, a box showing how to test seed corn to get a good stand, charts on soils soil preparation and the use of fertilizers. Exhibits of the boll weevil and its work.

A boll weevil expert will give full information of the methods of beating this pest.

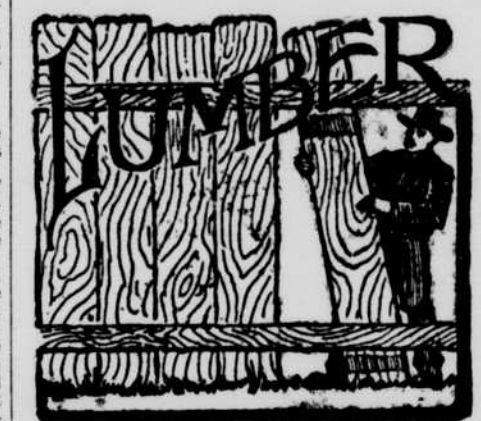

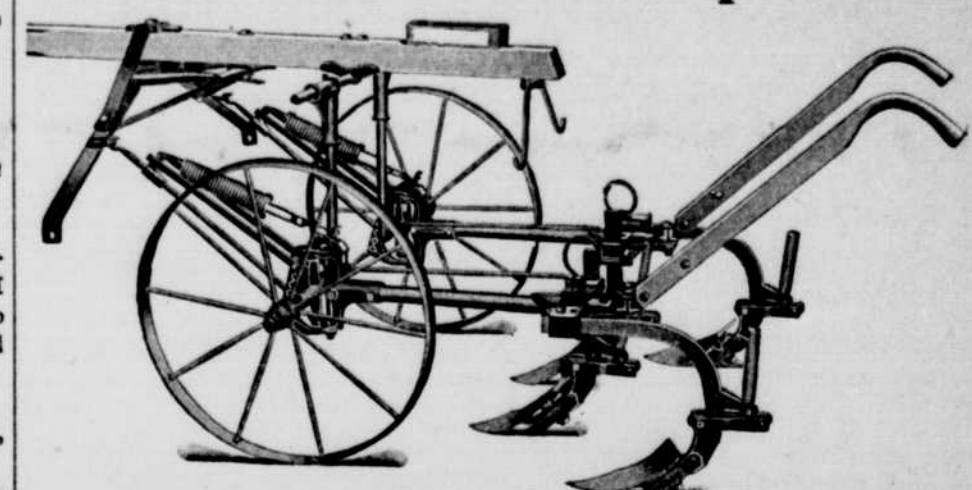

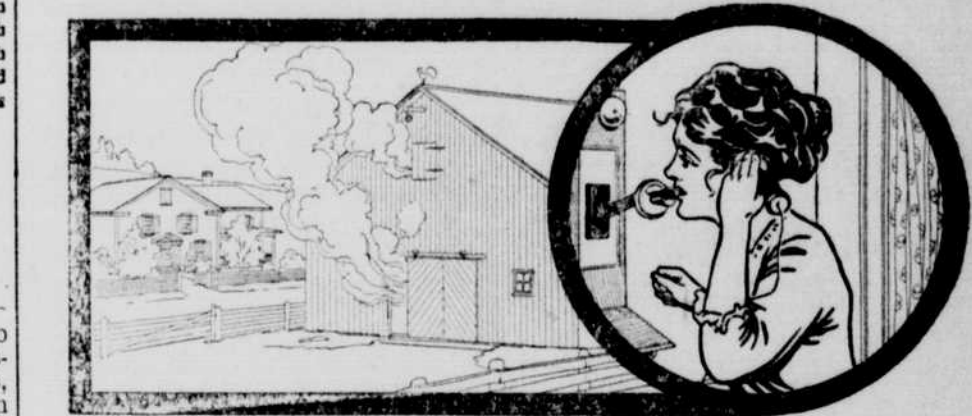
