United States of America : Patons & Butcher,

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, TO WIT:

WHEREAS a Label hath been filed in the District Court of the United States for the District of Columbia,

by the United States Attorney for the said District, against the Ship Monsoon,

her Tackle, Apparel and Furniture and her Cargo, stating, alledging and pro-

pounding that after the passage of a certain Statute or Act of Congress, entitled

"An Act to interdict the commercial intercourse between the United States and Great Britain and France and their dependencies,"

and after the passing of the Statute or Act of Congress, entitled "An Act concerning the commercial intercourse between the United States and Great Britain and France and their dependencies,"

and after the passing of one other statute or act of Congress, entitled "An act supplementary to the act entitled an act concerning the commercial intercourse between the U States and Great Britain and France, and their dependencies, and for other purposes";

and after due notice of the said acts, at the Custom Houses respectively, that is to say, on the twenty sixth day of October, 1812, a certain cargo of goods, wares and merchandise, of the growth, produce or manufacture of Great Britain, was imported from the port of Liverpool, situated in Great Britain, into the port of Alexandria, in the District of Alexandria, within the proper jurisdiction of this Court, by Hugh Smith, and others, in a certain Ship called the Monsoon, com-

manded by Nathaniel Williams, which said ship departed from the aforesaid British port subsequent to the second day of February, 1811, contrary to the aforesaid act of Congress, by reason of the violation of which said acts of Congress, and by virtue thereof, the said Ship, Tackle, Apparel and Furniture, and also her Cargo aforesaid have become wholly forfeited and liable to be seized and condemned in this Court. And pursuant to a warrant from the Hon. William Cranch, Chief Judge of the United States Circuit Court, of the District of Columbia, commissioned to hold the District Court of the United States, in and for the District of Columbia—I do hereby give public notice, that he said information and libel is filed by Walter Jones, Junr. Esqr. attorney of the United States, for the said District, and trial will be had on the said libel at the District Court of the United States, to be holden on the third Monday in Nov. next, at the Court House in Alexandria, at 10 o'clock, A. M. of which all persons interested, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
